


An organization with global reach

(* plus the European Union which, since July 2007, has rights akin to those of a WCO Member for matters falling within its competences as an interim measure.)






WCO Mission

- To study all questions relating to co-operation in Customs matters
- To examine the technical aspects of Customs systems with a view to attaining the highest possible degree of harmony and uniformity
- To prepare Conventions and amendments to Conventions
- To make recommendations to ensure the uniform interpretation and application of the Conventions
- To furnish information or advice
- To help its Members to respond to modern challenges
- To co-operate with other inter-governmental organizations

 Agreement with OIE





Border Agency Cooperation

- WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement
- 136 ratifications
- Implementation rate LDCs today 0.5%
- Implementation rate DCs today 50.6%

Almost all LDCs and half of the DCs need more time/assistance to meet the TFA commitment on Border Agency Cooperation!
